Dear Mr. Colvin:

The New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (Department) has reviewed the information submitted on May 27, 2016 by the Department of the Army, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to advise this office of the intended actions to address the debris piles found to the northeast of the FTMM-25 landfill.

The proposed action of removing each debris pile via over-excavation (a minimum of one foot of underlying soil will be removed with the debris at each location) is acceptable. As indicated, field screening and visual observations will be performed during debris removal for evidence of hazardous substance materials, and PID readings collected during excavation activities, as appropriate.

As noted, if the former/current presence of a hazardous material is indicated, sampling is to be performed. However, sampling parameters must include TCL+TICs/TAL, and EPH, rather than TAL only.

The debris will be incorporated into FTMM-25 prior to capping activities. Incorporation of the excavated solid waste/construction debris into FTMM-25 is acceptable.
