Dear Ms. Siano:

On February 10, 2010, the U.S. Army Fort Monmouth, Directorate of Public Works (DPW) requested authorization from the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) via a Permit-by-Rule pursuant to the New Jersey Pollutant Discharge Elimination System, N.J.A.C. 7:14A-1 et seq. to permit the emplacement of Oxygen Release Compound (ORC®) Advanced into excavations following the removal of underground storage tanks (USTs) that stored refined petroleum products (No. 2 fuel oil). The emplacement of ORC Advanced into the excavation serves to enhance the aerobic biodegradation of petroleum hydrocarbons associated with No. 2 fuel oil discharges.

Pursuant to N.J.A.C. 7:26E-7.2(c), the DPW included a draft Public Notice in the Permit-by-Rule request. On February 17, 2010, the NJDEP approved DPW's Permit-by-Rule and draft Public Notice. These regulations also require that upon receiving NJDEP approval of the draft public notice and prior to publishing the public notice, the DPW will provide a copy of:

- the approved public notice to the clerk for each municipality in which the contaminated site is located, and to the designated local health official; and
- the Discharge to Groundwater (DGW) proposal to the clerk for each municipality in which the contaminated site is located and to the designated local health official, if requested.

Attached is the DGW proposal (Permit-by-Rule) and the approved Public Notice satisfying the above requirements.
