The Department of the Army (Army), pursuant to the Defense Base Closure and Realignment Act of 1990 (Public Law 101-510), as amended, is implementing the recommendations of the 2005 Base Closure and Realignment Commission (BRAC). The BRAC Commission recommended closure of Fort Monmouth, New Jersey. Accordingly, the Army proposes to dispose of its real property interests at Fort Monmouth and to transfer the excess property to new owners. In accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), the Army has prepared an Environmental Assessment (EA) that identifies, documents, and evaluates the potential environmental effects of property disposal and future use of Fort Monmouth.

A copy of the Final Environmental Assessment of the Implementation of Base Realignment and Closure at Fort Monmouth, New Jersey and the draft Finding of No Significant Impact accompanies this letter and is provided for your review during the federal-mandated 30-day review period. The EA concludes that there will be no significant impacts to the environment, including cultural resources. Note that the Army is also in the process of consulting with the New Jersey Historic Preservation Office, in accordance with Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act, working toward the completion of a Programmatic Agreement designed to mitigate the effects associated with closure. We previously invited your participation in the Section 106 process and we remain interested in any relevant information you may be able to provide.


