

Environmental Condition of Property

ECP Background

- CFR February 2006
- Base Redevelopment and Realignment Manual March 1, 2006

ECP Objective

- Provide an environmental characterization of a property for use during transfer
- Assist prospective owners with understanding environmental condition of the property

ECP Scope

All aspects of environmental condition to simplify process




Historical Records Review

- Standard Environmental Resources and Offsite Repositories
 - 24 standard databases searched
 - Included State and Federal Databases
- Historical Deeds and Real Estate Easement Information
- U.S. Army Center for Health Promotion and Preventive Medicine (USACHPPM) files
- U.S. Army Environmental Command (USAEC) files
- Fort Monmouth On Site files and records
 - Directorate of Public Works
 - Safety offices Garrison and Mission
 - Real Property records
 - Historical maps and engineering drawings
- Total records reviewed excess of 5,000 documents

Aerial Photography Analysis

- Aerial photographs dating from 1940 – 1991 evaluated
- Evaluated for previous uses and changes over time
 - Former buildings
 - Former fuel storage areas
 - Disturbed areas






Visual Site Inspections (VSIs)

Reconnaissance

- Entire facility perimeter
- All roads and building exteriors

Detailed VSIs

- 122 Buildings
- Individual buildings selected based on historical or current use
- Buildings representative of low potential impact uses (residential, administrative)

Interviews

- Conducted with personnel possessing relevant knowledge of historical and current operations and conditions of the property
- Over 40 Individuals contacted during VSIs and follow-up document reviews

- Category 1 Areas where no release or disposal of hazardous or petroleum products has occurred.
- Category 2 Areas where only release or disposal of petroleum products has occurred.
- Category 3 Areas of contamination below action levels.
- Category 4 Areas where storage, release, disposal, and/or migration of hazardous substances has occurred and all necessary removal and/or response actions have been taken.
- Category 5 Areas of known contamination where release, disposal, and/or migration of hazardous substances has occurred and removal and/or response actions are underway.
- Category 6 Areas of known contamination where required response actions have not been taken.
- Category 7 Areas that are not evaluated or require further evaluation.








